— GRACE BAPTIST CHURCH, CHRISTCHURCH —

In the ministry of the Word we have finished our study on the book of James in May and have just completed a short series of sermons on the Biblical doctrine of Heaven. We will soon be commencing a series on the doctrine of salvation in the book of Romans. We continue to pray that we will be doers of the Word and not hearers only (James 1:22).

On Saturday June 27 the married couples in the church will be getting together to encourage one another in our marriages. We will be watching the DVD of a sermon on marriage, spend some time in discussion and prayer, and also have lunch together. We are looking to the Lord to strengthen our marriages and family life, for our joy, God's glory, and the sake of the Gospel. Proverbs 24:3, 4)

We continue to hold weekly meetings (Sundays@4.30) at the Rolleston Community Centre. The adults who come are studying through John's Gospel, seeking to highlight the gospel and the matchless person of Christ.
