Our fourteenth School of Theology was held in July with Jim Renihan teaching the first of a two-part course on Baptist Symbolics (the Confessions of Faith). Sixteen men attended and benefitted greatly from Jim's extensive research into the first and second London Confessions: their history, language and theology. We are planning for the second part of the course to be taught in July 2024. We have continued our monthly community meal gospel outreach endeavour: there has been a small attendance at each and we will continue through November, at which time we will review and decide whether this will resume next year. Other meetings of the church continue to be faithfully attended, and we have occasional visitors to one or other of our Sunday services. We have just begun a Sunday morning series through Matthew's gospel.
